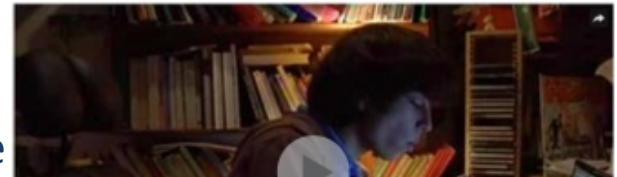
- In 2014, 12,5% of children were victims of cyber harassment
- In France, in 2018:
 - 7 out of 10 women have been victims of violence online
 - 92% of the sexist terms pronounced has not been erased
- G7 (9-10 of May 2019) of the ministries of equality → fight against cyber harassment is a priority
- Necessity to act, by two different ways:

- Prevention focused on the cyber violence against teenager
- Solutions developed through the education: resource pack for parents in 2018 created by the National Education ministry

- An important training program, announced by the French president, to prevent and detect cyberviolence
- This program will be particularly directed to teachers.



- G7 (9-10 of May 2019) of the ministries of equality —→ fight against cyber harassment is a priority: common declaration
- Law for real equality between men and woman —→ creates the offense for « online harassment »
- France has known a great step forward into the prosecution of violences on Internet with the 3rd of august 2018 law:
 - it extends the definition of « online harassment » to include « mobing », people sharing can be included.
- In July 2019, French National Assembly voted a law to fight against online hate: it proposes to tax (until 1,25 M€) platforms that don't erase sexist insults
